

The SouthStar Bank Moulton Branch restoration project began with the goal of restoring the building with an authentic interpretation of its turn-of-the-century Victorian architecture. Many desirable features were restored within the building, including the original longleaf pine floors, pine structural columns, ornate pressed metal ceiling, and the stately, half-moon window overlooking the rolling hills of the Moulton countryside. The project was designed and executed by local contractors, craftsmen, and designers.

Offices and teller line structures were rebuilt using white oak with block paneling. The original pressed metal ceiling was kept, while new pressed metal ceilings were added into the office areas. Inspired by early bank buildings, iron work arches and antique iron windows were installed along the teller line.

The cut glass panels that adorn the areas above the large front picture windows, front door, and side panels of the office entryways were designed and produced by a bank employee. The lobby bathroom walls are tiled with replica encaustic tile that imitate the iron work of the lobby.

The two-tiered chandelier in the lobby features hand cut colored glass that was assembled in New York. The other lighting fixtures in the lobby are authentic reproductions of early 1900s fixtures.
